Internationally acclaimed photographer Dianne Bos returns to her hometown of Dundas for this special exhibit of works from the past 10 years including, fittingly, book camera pieces (made with books converted into pinhole cameras). The Carnegie Gallery is a former library which Bos frequented as a child. Bos' pinhole photographs, with their sometimes ghostly imagery, have been exhibited around the world.

"I'm fascinated by the history of photography and the science of light and how different devices change our perception of time and space," says Bos. "My work challenges the view of photography as a way to 'capture an instant in time.' Viewers have said that my work evokes the memory-image that remains for them long after they have viewed a familiar location."
